
# Is Binge Worship the next big thing? - By Paul Scott

Grace United Church has come of age.

Just like watching Season 1 or 2 of The Crown or Suits, now worshipers are flocking to the Grace Church YouTube Channel to catch up on all the online worship services in Season 1.

Seriously, we really do hope that our online worship services are providing some comfort, inspiration and peace of mind during this Covid 19 epidemic.

Our guiding lights in the new way of coming together are Paul Harding and Donna Norman along with other familiar faces and special musical guests. Recently we kept track of all the time spent. Our 40-minute presentation took 90 hours to produce. But the results speak volumes of the love and care that goes into every aspect of the music, message and prayers.



At our last Session meeting on April 28<sup>th</sup> a decision was made to continue to have our online services headed up by Paul and Donna during our time away from each other. When we are able to meet again in our church building, Session agreed that that was the proper time to once again engage with our Lay Worship Leaders as we did before the March shut down.

Through the magic of the internet, our services share the talents of special musical guests. Our Easter soloist was Nayeli Abrego, singing "Forever (We Sing Hallelujah)" as recorded at Grace in the summer of 2018. We also supplemented the organ with Kate Harding Smith and Gillian MacDonald's trumpeting, recorded from their homes.

The following Sunday, our own Grace Church Choir presented "A Never Ending Alleluia" which was recorded at a fund-raiser in 2003 for the Guatemala Stove Project. April 26, our friend Cliff Edwards shared the gospel favourite, "Just a Closer Walk with Thee".

May 3, our dear friend Maryanne Wainman from Kingston recorded "For the Beauty of the Earth", her in her home and Paul Harding at home at his computer, and Kristen Dubenion-Smith, our soloist on May10, was heard on YouTube and approached for permission to share her distanSING in our service.

Next Sunday (May 17) sees the return of Alison MacDonald, who sang in Grace Church when she was at the Thousand Islands Playhouse in 2016. This duet is recorded in Gananoque and in Edmonton.

Future services will include "You'll Never Walk Alone", recorded by the late David Tompkins in 1968, and "The Prayer", sung by Nayeli and Tonatiuh Abrego and recorded in Petrolia Ontario.

### Production of Online Worship Services is Rewarding - By Paul Harding

The online worship service for Grace United Church is produced by receiving components submitted by various congregation members – a greeting, candle lighting, scripture reading, prayers and meditation. These videos are recorded on people's phones or tablets, in the safe isolation of their own home and sent to our music director for processing. The music is prepared using software called "FINALE", each note entered one at a time by playing on a musical keyboard connected to a computer. The finished music is recorded and ready to use in the service.

Using editing software called "MOVAVI", the components are stitched together into one file and pictures found on the internet are added to complement the speech. Lyrics for the hymns are added, to encourage viewers to sing along, and the lyrics are layed over graphics which reflect the words.

Announcements and other information are added during the Prelude and Postlude and the finished service is sent to YouTube for publishing, and the link is shared via social media, email and word of mouth. You merely have to click on the link to enjoy a 40-minute Online Worship Service.
