Message from Official Board Chair, Brian Brooks

"As many of you are aware, an announcement by Premier Doug Ford gives permission for church congregations in our area of the province to resume services, albeit with a limit of 30% of church capacity."

Board chair Brian Brooks notes, "Additionally, the United Church of Canada has strongly recommended that only members under the age of 70 should attend the services. Those with vulnerable immune systems should not attend and there is to be no congregational singing or choir and all must wear masks. There is to be no socializing. We are far from pre-pandemic days of worship. The restrictions on worship at Grace, or any church, for that matter, make online worship a safer and more viable option at this time."

As a result and considering the need to keep all parishioners safe, "we have made tentative arrangements with our friends at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church to hold joint services, with each church preparing a service on alternate Sundays, starting with Grace United Church on Sunday, June 28," chair Brooks notes.

With summer fast approaching and the uncertainties surrounding the COVID 19 pandemic, the question about how best to handle our online worship experience was discussed at our May 26^{th} Session meeting.

The fact that both St. Andrew's Presbyterian and Grace United used to share summer services for close to 40 years beginning in the 1970s, was not lost in the collective memories of both congregations.

Working closely together, we will be sharing our online services. Each congregation will create an online worship service on alternate weeks. Grace will begin with the service on June 28th and that link will be shared with our friends at St. Andrews. And then it will be St. Andrew's turn to share their service with us on July 5.

Considering the recent announcements from the Ontario Government and the United Church of Canada regarding the reopening of in-person worship and the safety measures that came with those announcements, sharing online services seems to be a more viable option at this time.

Both congregations recognize that the number one priority is the safety of those most vulnerable which our government agencies list as those over 70 years of age and those with health concerns. Other measures like personal distancing, wearing masks, no congregational singing, no socializing etc. make our current online method of worship all the more meaningful. Further, sharing alternate Sundays will give those volunteers in both congregations who spend 100s of hours producing these services, a well-deserved break.

We wish to thank Paul Harding from Grace and Robin Ableson from St. Andrew's who initiated and followed through on sharing services.

Pine Street Reconstruction Underway - By Brian Brooks



The temporary water pipes are now being put in place and the Pine St. reconstruction project will get underway by the last week of June. This is a complete re-build of the street from William St. to the west end of Pine. The expected completion date is the end of November of this year.

The new street will be one way from east to west and will include a bike and walking surface. Parking will be allowed on the south side of the roadway. Church officials have received assurances that the trees in front of Grace Church on Pine St. will NOT be removed.

The contractor has offered to work with the church if access to the switch-back assessable ramp is needed during construction. This information came from the Town employee who is overseeing this project and he will keep the church informed via Laurie Cadue or myself, on anything develops that will affect the church.
