Sanctuary closed, church continues online

In view of the 37 positive cases of Covid 19 in the Gananoque area, and the district health unit moving the area from Green-Prevent to Yellow-Protect on Monday, Official Board chair Brian Brooks announces that Sunday's worship service will be online only. *There will be no in-person worship at the church.*

In consultation with Rev. Takouhi and other church board chairs, it has been further decided that Sunday services at Grace United will continue online only until the Gananoque area reverts back to Green.

Each Sunday the worship services will be live streamed on Facebook at 10:30 a.m. and will also be on YouTube a little later in the day.

"We have been closely monitoring this recent surge and the health and safety of our congregants is paramount," said Mr. Brooks. "We have had no Covid cases linked to our church and we do not want any," he said.

The Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health Unit is currently reporting a total of 64 cases with and as on Monday afternoon 37 active cases are linked to the Gananoque outbreak. Of the 64 cases, 63 are termed "community spread" and one is a health care worker.

Grace United ends year with a bang, 2021 looks promising!

First, we were allowed limited seating in our sanctuary on Sunday mornings, that was an amazing gift and we saw attendance range from 31 to 59 each November Sunday. Then on November 15th, we were blessed to have our new Minister, Rev. Takouhi begin to lead us in Sunday morning worship. We also have improved our technology to live stream services as well as provide the full service on YouTube that can be watched later.

Although many challenges still exist with Covid-19, we have had so many successes this fall, our pie sales were fantastic, and we organized a couple of Sunday's in December to provide Spirit of Giving opportunities to the Food Bank and Interval House.

The stewards and the official board have worked to draft a 2021 budget where we have set a target of \$213,300 for expenses with matching revenue. Fortunately, we do have some access to Trustee funds to help subsidize our work; however, we have incorporated some ambitious expectations with weekly offerings and fundraising opportunities. Fundraising is exactly that, members of the church family having fun while raising additional dollars to cover our essential operating costs or for specific needs in the community. There are many church members bringing forth fundraising ideas regularly, so 2021 should be an exciting year even with the required safety restrictions for Covid-19.

Total revenue for year-to-date November 2020 was \$167,230 compared to \$200,162 in 2019. Total expense for year-to-date November 2020 was \$142,688 compared to \$160,253 in 2019. From Special Grace Church Missions, we provided \$500 to the Children's Toy Drive and the Foodbank.

The Official Board of Grace United Church is elected by all members of the congregation and comprised of the Board of Stewards, the Session, and representatives of various committees and organizations.

The Nominating Committee is inviting people to step forward and volunteer for some positions that need to be filled.

Terms on Session and the Board of Stewards are usually three years. Ideally, there should be a mixture of new and seasoned members. Meetings are held monthly,



September through June.

The Session has a few vacancies and responsibilities of Session members could be divided into five areas: Worship, Membership, Faith Formation & Christian Education, Pastoral Care & Visitation, and Outreach.

The Board of Stewards is also hoping to fill a few positions. The Stewards manage the financial affairs of the congregation by assisting in securing contributions, disbursing the money received, fundraising, reporting the financial condition of the Congregation to the Official Board, and presenting financial statements at the Annual Meeting.

The congregation appoints Members of the Board of Trustees for longer terms, due to the nature of their work. The Trustees administer funds held in trust, such as bequests from estates.

The Ministry & Personnel Committee is also hoping to add more members. They liaise between church staff and the congregation.

So please, if you have not served on a church board or committee in a number of years or if you have never served, please consider doing so and contact a member of the Nominating Committee, indicating your area of interest by Sunday, January 17.
