Dr. Walter Brueggemann¹ and his lovely wife, Tia.

This was beyond our imagination that such a day would be in store for us. When Gary and I talked about a road trip, Gary

asked: "Where would you like to go?" And my answer, without any hesitation was: "I would love to visit Walter and have lunch or dinner with him." My amazing husband's response was: "Let's do it." After all, we have never driven more than ten hours to get to a destination. After getting all technicalities in place, we

started our journey towards the Brueggemann residence on August 23, 2023. We decided to drive the ten hours in two days.

The roads were pretty good, and thanks to Hwy. 407 we skipped most of Toronto's traffic and made it to London, Ont., around supper time. We decided to stop at Canada's favourite place, Tim Hortons, and had a bite to eat. However, as we stopped, the rainfall became more intense, and we made sure to fill the car with gasoline as well as our bodies with energy and continued our road trip.

Once we arrived at Middlesex County, between London and Sarnia, we started seeing rain in biblical proportions. The OPP had blocked Hwy. 402 and redirected everyone to the back country roads. I could not take a picture of the fields that were filled with water, but I found a picture online from that evening news that I share with you here.

My first reaction was: "Where do I go?" Gary said: "Just follow the big trucks, I am sure they are headed to the border as well." And he was right.

This unexpected rainfall created a bit of worry in me, traffic, and a bottleneck at the Blue Water Bridge at Port Huron's U.S. border, but that was our destination for the first night. Comfortable sleeping quarters for about a twelve-hour period,

and the journey continued the next day.

Yes, we ended up spending a wonderful day with the Brueggemanns, not just a lunch or a dinner; and August 25, 2023, is etched in our hearts with Joy, beautiful conversations, Love and Respect beyond our imagination – a moment in time I will always remember as **Sweet Grace**.

Beloved, we drove over two-thousand kilometers and had the privilege to stop by and visit family in Woodstock and Cambridge, as well, on our

way back home, and that was an additional blessing. If you ask, would we do it again? Our reply, with no hesitation will be – **"YES!"** We would do it again in a heartbeat. Did our bodies get

tired? Yes! But the **Blessings outweigh the physical efforts**. A great reminder that **God's Blessings require our participation and perspiration, but it is worth it!** Our Work is NEVER in vain.

Prior to Covid, Grace Church offered a monthly Messy Church to interested families and individuals in our community. Messy Church is an alternative form of worship for all ages



that involves creativity, celebration and hospitality. It is part of an international organization that began in England in 2004. Although it is aimed primarily at families, Messy Church is non-denominational, and open to anyone in the community who wishes to attend. Our only stipulation is that children must be accompanied by an adult. However, adults do not need a child to attend. It is Bible-based and Christ-centred and typically includes a welcome activity, a creative time to explore the biblical theme with activities, games and crafts; a celebration time involving a Bible story, prayer, and songs; and a sit-down meal together.

Our Messy Church was shut down unexpectedly by Covid but there has been interest expressed in reviving it. However, presenting Messy Church needs a committee of about 10 individuals who are interested in planning the program, preparing and supervising crafts and preparing the meal. At the present time we do not have enough individuals to run a full Messy Church program.

We are planning to start with a Saturday afternoon Birthday Party for Jesus on December 9th. This will include crafts, snacks, a birthday cake, sharing the Bible story of the first Christmas, and other activities. Any families or individuals who are interested will be invited to join us to celebrate the real meaning of Christmas.

Oldest member of Grace United celebrates his 99th

Two years before The United Church of Canada was established, Charlie Donevan was born. That was July 31, 1923. This past summer Charlie gathered with well-wishers outside Donevan's Hardware to celebrate his 99th birthday.



Asked about longevity, with a twinkle in his eye, he replied, "and I don't feel a day over 98!" Decked out in a black tail coat and matching top hat and proudly seated in the old McLaughlin carriage outside his store, Charlie welcomed local dignitaries, residents and friends and shared a piece of birthday cake.

One could say that Charlie and Donevan's Hardware are fixtures in this town, but Charlie is also a life- long member of Grace United Church and that family affiliation goes back generations. His grandfather, James Donevan was church

treasurer for 30 years and his father Charles Sr. was involved with all aspects of church work – right down to pumping the organ!

Charlie tells the story of his dad, as a young boy, being given the job each Sunday of keeping the bellows inflated on the old pump organ. Located back behind a wooden screen was a stool and two foot pedals. Perhaps an early rendition of the modern Cubii foot pedal exerciser. It was tough work for a young boy and the long sermons lacked excitement. One Sunday, young Charles dosed off, only to be disturbed by a pounding on the wooden screen.



"He immediately wakened and started pumping furiously." The service continued!

As for Charles Jr, the 99 year old one, he has dedicated his life to the work and programming at Grace United whether serving on church boards, teaching Sunday school, helping with church suppers or fixing furnaces. Charlie was there.

He was very involved with the Sea Scout troop and yours truly will always remember the annual camping weekends on Burnt Island. Charlie was the cook. So bright and early, we'd hear the wood fire crackling in the huge stone cook stove. The coffee would be on for the leaders and Charlie had the huge iron frying pans heated and ready for the bacon and eggs. It was quite the spread!

Then there were the Easter Sunday sunrise services on the big rock at Landon Bay. Wasn't everybody wide awake and ready to go at 5 a.m.?

Charlie has been extremely interested and involved in his community. He was a town councilor and between community and church, he also found the time to establish and develop Landon Bay Vacation Centre. Not wanting to see the large tract of land with its beautiful lookout fall into the hands of developers, he subscribed local folks to kick in some money and purchased the old Cross farm. When it was time to change chapters, The Landon Bay board of directors approached Parks Canada and the property became part of 1000 Islands National Park.

To conclude, in the 1990's during Festival of the Islands, Charlie reached back into his childhood river past and re-created the tin boat races. The Donevan family owned a small island on the back side of Tremont Is. It was a yearly tradition of build tin boats. This involved "finding" a sheet of tin roofing somewhere in town, some wood, nails and tar. During the Festival, Charlie held workshops for young folks interested in building a tin boat. It became very popular and each year races were held at Confederation Park in the centre of town. The 1000 Islands Boat Museum just recently created a display featuring the tin boat. It is worth a visit.

And that's a bit of what I remember as a guy growing up at Grace Church with Charlie.
